St. Irenaeus' Pilgrims Celebrated Fr. Patrick's Promotion in July

On July 21, about 50 St. Irenaeus parishioners, and parishioners from other parishes in Los Angeles and Orange Counties, gathered at the home of Ruth Burns in Cypress to celebrate the promotion of St. Irenaeus' Pastor, Fr. Patrick Moses. At the request of His Most Reverend Kevin W. Vann, Bishop of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Orange, Fr. Patrick became Rector of Holy Family Cathedral in Orange on July 1.

All of the people who came to Fr. Patrick's celebration dinner had joined one or more of the 11 pilgrimages on which Fr. Patrick served as Spiritual Director. They were happy that Fr. Patrick was promoted, but they were sad that

he was leaving St. Irenaeus. He had always inspired his parishioners to live the gospel in their daily lives. Many parishioners already miss him and wish for his return to St. Irenaeus, but they know that God has plans to use Fr. Patrick's many talents to benefit other people.

Fr. Patrick said that he has spent 12 years as a priest at St. Irenaeus. When he first came to St. Irenaeus in 2004, he served as a Parochial Vicar for four years. He was then assigned to Santiago de Compostela Church in Lake Forest in 2008 for one year as Parochial Vicar.

He returned to St. Irenaeus parish in 2009 where he served as Administrator of for two years. He was named Pastor at St. Irenaeus in September 2011 and was active as Pastor until June of 2017.

Although he will no longer be at St. Irenaeus, he still will be traveling with some of the pilgrims on new pilgrimages to Ireland and England in September of 2017 and to the Holy Land again in 2018.

After viewing the pilgrimage videos, Fr. Patrick introduced Fr. Rudy Alumam. Fr. Rudy was one of the Parochial Vicars at St. Irenaeus but was also transferred to Holy Family Cathedral at the same time.

What Is the Romans Road to Salvation?

The Romans Road to salvation is a way of explaining the good news of salvation using verses from the Book of Romans. It is a simple yet powerful method of explaining why we need salvation, how God provided salvation, how we can receive salvation, and what are the results of salvation.

The first verse on the Romans Road to salvation is Romans 3:23, "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God." We have all sinned. We have all done things that are displeasing to God. There is no one who is innocent.

Romans 3:10-18 gives a detailed picture of what sin looks like in our lives. The second Scripture on the Romans Road to salvation, Romans 6:23, teaches us about the consequences of sin - "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." The punishment that we have earned for our sins is death. Not just physical death, but eternal death!

The third verse on the Romans Road to salvation picks up where Romans 6:23 left off, "but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." Romans 5:8 declares, "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Je-

sus Christ died for us! Jesus' death paid for the price of our sins. Jesus resurrection proves that God accepted Jesus' death as the payment for our sins.

The fourth stop on the Romans Road to salvation is Romans 10:9, "that if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved."

Because of Jesus' death on our behalf, all we have to do is believe in Him, trust-



ing His death as the payment for our sins - and we will be saved! Romans 10:13 says it again, "for everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

Jesus died to pay the penalty for our sins and rescue us from eternal death. Salvation, the forgiveness of sins, is available to anyone who will trust in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.

The final aspect of the Romans Road to salvation is the results of salvation. Romans 5:1 has this wonderful message, "Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus

Christ."

Through Jesus Christ we can have a relationship of peace with God. Romans 8:1 teaches us, "Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus." Because of Jesus' death on our behalf, we will never be condemned for our sins.

Finally, we have this precious promise of God from Romans 8:38-39, "For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Would you like to follow the Romans Road to salvation? If so, here is a simple prayer you can pray to God. Saying this prayer is a way to declare to God that you are relying on Jesus Christ for your salvation. The words themselves will not save you. Only faith in Jesus Christ can provide salvation!

"God, I know that I have sinned against you and am deserving of punishment. But Jesus Christ took the punishment that I deserve so that through faith in Him I could be forgiven. With your help, I place my trust in You for salvation. Thank You for Your wonderful grace and forgiveness - the gift of eternal life! Amen!"

The Benefits & Risks of a Titanium Knee Replacement?

The most significant benefit of knee replacement surgery is pain relief, notes WebMD. Since it removes the diseased tissues that cause pain, it can be successful at curing it. It can also improve joint function in some patients, but this is less reliable.

However, many patients still experience joint stiffness or weakness after having knee replacement surgery. Patients who follow rehabilitation guidelines are likely to have better outcomes, such as a wider range of motion.

Total knee replacement can increase mobility and decrease pain in people who have an injured or arthritic knee joint. More than 90 percent of patients who have knee replacement surgery experience less pain and greater

mobility in their knee after the procedure.

Risks associated with total knee replacement depend in part on the age and overall health of the patient. People with serious heart or lung problems usually are not good candidates for knee replacement surgery. Chronic health conditions (e.g., diabetes) can increase the risk for complications.

Complications from knee replacement surgery, such as infection or blood clots, can interfere with recovery. In general, fewer than 2 percent of total knee replacement surgeries result in serious complications.

Titanium and titanium-alloy knee implants can reduce the risk of complications such as bone resorp-

tion, according to BoneSmart. This occurs because titanium has an elasticity that is more similar to natural bone when compared to other implant materials.

Titanium is also highly resistant to corrosion, which means it does not change after being placed in the body, notes BoneSmart. Unlike most other types of metal used in knee replacement surgery, pure titanium does not contain nickel, so it is a good choice for people who are allergic to nickel, according to the Hospital for Special Surgery. It is strong yet lightweight.

Difficulty in giving titanium a smooth, high-polish finish can affect the motion of the joint, notes the Hospital for Special Surgery. Cobalt chrome reaches that finish more easily.

Cobalt-chromium alloys and titanium are two of the most popular materials used in knee replacements, notes BoneSmart.

Overview of Knee Replacement

The knee is one of the most complex joints in the body. The knees support the body's entire weight and are vulnerable to injury and arthritis (e.g., osteoarthritis). Arthritis in the knee can cause significant joint damage, result in severe knee pain, and make it difficult to walk or climb stairs. Severe cases can cause the thigh to become misaligned with the lower leg.

Treatment for knee pain and joint damage caused by injury or arthritis may involve weight loss, over-the-counter (OTC) and prescription pain relievers, physical therapy, use of a cane or walker, steroid injections, or a combination of these therapies. Severe damage to the knee that does not respond to these treat-

ments may require total knee replacement.

Knee replacement is a surgical procedure that involves removing the kneecap (patella) and damaged cartilage and tissue from the knee joint, the ends of the thighbone (femur), and the shinbone (tibia). Damaged tissue is then replaced with an artificial knee (prosthesis) made of metal and plastic. The prosthesis restores the function of the knee.

When considering total knee replacement surgery, patients should consult with qualified health care providers, including a primary care doctor and an orthopedic surgeon, as well as with family members.

Proper care after the surgery, which may involve post-surgical care in an extended care facility, is vital to ensure a successful knee replacement and complete recovery.

Knee replacements are most commonly performed in people between 60 and 80 years of age. However, younger people with severe knee pain and disability also may benefit from the procedure. In the United States, hundreds of thousands of knee replacement surgeries are performed each year.

Indications for Knee Replacement Surgery

Total knee replacement may be recommended when other treatment options (e.g., weight loss, pain relievers) no longer reduce knee pain and disability effectively. Symptoms of knee damage that may require knee replacement surgery include the following:

- Knee pain that hinders walking, climbing stairs, or getting in and out of a chair
- Knee pain that interferes with sleep or does not subside with rest
- Inability to cope with side effects of pain relief medication
- Knee swelling that does not respond to treatment and that limits bending or straightening the knee
- Significant bowing in or out of the knee

Los Angeles Teen Challenge Announces Walk For Recovery

5K Event Is 1 of 8 Regional "Walks for Recovery" Events Held in 2017 to Support Addiction Recovery

The Los Angeles chapter of Teen Challenge of Southern California (TCSC) will hold a 5K Walk for Recovery on Sept. 23 to raise awareness and funds to aid those recovering from drug and alcohol addiction. Check-in for the event begins at 9:30 a.m. and the Walk starts at 10:30 a.m. at Valley Christian High School, 17700 Dumont Ave. in Cerritos. The 5K is one of eight regional TCSC Walks for Recovery held at various locations throughout Southern California.

The Walks for Recovery are being held during National Recovery Month, which is sponsored every September by the Substance Abuse and Health Services Administration to increase awareness and understanding of mental and substance use issues and celebrate the people who recover. TCSC is part of a global network that is generally acknowledged to be the most successful drug and alcohol recovery program of its type in the world.

"For 54 years we have been bringing the message of hope and freedom through God's transforming power," says Ron Brown, Executive Director of TCSC. "Tens of thousands of lives have been changed through Teen Challenge since our founding in 1963 but

so much still needs to be done."

Los Angeles County Teen Challenge is part of the TCSC network that has more than 500 beds to serve both men and women struggling with life-controlling issues. The 12-month residential program for adults is offered at no charge to those in need. TCSC is funded by the donations of thousands of supporters and special events such as the Walk for Recovery. The organization receives no government funding.

Other 5K Walks for Recovery will be held in September in Ventura, San Diego, Bakersfield, Riverside, Redley, and South Gate, as well as in Costa Mesa on June 24. Participants can register to walk at any of these locations at <http://tcwalks.com>. Registration is \$25 per person or \$100 per family. Upon registration, participants can create a personal profile that will allow them to raise support online and through social media from friends and family.





Family-Friendly Day Trips

California Science Center Is Brainy Fun

In Exposition Park, next to the Natural History Museum, is the California Science Center where children can explore the wonders of aerospace engineering, life sciences, and architecture with engaging interactive exhibits. The center is fairly easy to drive to, as trips into this area of LA go, so don't be discouraged. And parking is \$12 and plentiful.

The California Science Center is free to visit but also offers a number of paid attractions, like an IMAX theater and rotating special exhibits like Body Worlds, which are well worth the price of the tickets. We watched my kid's first 3D IMAX movie which featured some really amazing underwater footage that really made him passionate about learning about marine life. The films regularly rotate so check the website and schedule your trip to coincide with the IMAX 3D movie your family might want to experience.

The reason we headed to the California Science Center was specifically for Body Worlds since my son was asking questions about the human body. This exhibit consists of plastinated real bodies, from

the nervous system to the muscular structures and skeletons down to the skins and organs. It is a look at the human body in a way most people never get to see in person and was interesting for my preschooler for about half an hour to forty-five minutes. (Warning: There is a human reproduction section that is roped off separately.) It was extremely fascinating for all the adults that attended though so still worth the ticket

After the IMAX movie and the Body Worlds exhibit, the kids were hungry and needed to run off some energy. The California Science Center has a kid friendly food court offering a variety of different cuisines that can appease the pickiest of palates. We found the pizza to be the best crowd pleaser for a group of six, and Exposition Park was a great place to get outside and run on the grass. There are a lot of vendors in the park, however, selling everything from snacks to ice cream and toys at a lower price than inside the Science Center.

On the upper floors, there are a few experience based machines that visitors can stand in to experience high speed winds, high magnitude earthquakes, and motion simulated rides, as well as a

number of rooms for kids of all ages but we spent a large amount of time in the Creative World. The interactive architecture and construction play stations really kept the kids' attention for a long period of time because of the different building areas lending to open ended play. As a result, one day is not enough to get through all the exhibits, rooms and attractions.

With more time, we would have definitely vested the Shuttle Endeavour exhibit, one of the main attractions at CSC, checked out the Ecology Cliff Climb, and spent time in the Discovery Rooms made for little learners. We will definitely be taking another trip back to see everything else the center has to offer.

Make sure to stop by the gift shop as it is an educational toy store of any parent's dreams. All the toys capture the child's imagination opening the door to curiosity based learning. Proceeds help to support this amazingly free center.




