On Facebook I started out with the goal of writing about ten taquerias in the greater Los Angeles region. With people offering their favorite taqueria, I had to raise that number to 25 and 25 doesn't do justice to the amount of taquerias in Los Angeles. I have chosen five of my favorite taquerias.

The first taqueria on the list is Al and Bea's in Boyle Heights, which has been in

business since 1966. I have been to the place more times than I care to admit. One time I pulled up late and asked the clerk, "What's going on?" He replied without changing expression, "Just waiting for you!"

What's Happening in Cerritos

Another heat wave is here and it is very hot! Please remember not to leave your pets or children in the car even for a little bit. Limit yourself to outside activity during peak hours, drink lots of water and go somewhere cool if you need to.

I have some great news to report on the crime front. For the first six months of this year residential burglaries are significantly down from 193 during the same period last year to 110. It is still 110 more than we need, but the reduction in 83 burglaries is a success. Thank you to Captain Nunez, Safety Manager Daryl Evans and all of LASD.

And a big shout out to the sheriff's department for their great video in participation of the national "lip sync challenge." You can view it on their website through most social media channels.

Several cars have unfortunately been stolen from our driveways so make sure to lock your vehicles and use a red club device if you have one. And residential burglaries use to just primarily take place between Monday and Friday from around 9 am until 3 pm. We are now getting hit at night and on the weekends. My wife recently saw a white male checking car doors and trunk handles at about 2 p.m. on our street. We called the sheriff and they arrested him quickly for being under the influence of drugs.

The ABC Board of Trustees recently voted 7-0 to put a \$258 million dollar bond on the ballot in November. I chaired the Facilities Committee and can report to you that we spent over 18 months working on the new Facilities Master Plan. Our team visits all the schools in the district and spoke with or got input from over 1,100 people. We brought the amount of the plan down by approximately \$400 million from the last Facilities Master Plan and concentrated

on safety, infrastructure and 21st century modernization. All of the money will go to making our kids safe and improving their learning environment. None of the money can go to teacher salaries or benefits.

The schools that I surveyed looked similar to the way they did when I went to Mary Bragg Elementary, Haskell Junior High and Gahr High School. They are simply not safe from an active shooter in my opinion and studies show that kids learn differently today. The district will be studying enrollment, school of choice and looking for alternative funding sources to help the bond measure succeed. The average assessed value in the ABC District is \$305,000 and approval of this measure would raise your property taxes approximately \$150 a year. If you are a senior like my parents and bought in the 1970's you will pay between \$25-\$50 a year.

The City is also continuing their summer activites at most of the parks. There is still a lot of fun to be had before school starts.

Last year, Justin Hogenauer traveled to South Africa with Earthwatch Institute to study the conservation of endangered rhinos facing threats from poachers. The small group of students and scientists ran dozens of experiments, including recording vigilance behavior, tracking spatial distributions and collecting dung.

As vice president of the Ecology and Wildlife Club at Whitney High School in Cerritos, Justin researched, planned and built two drought-tolerant and produce gardens, including coordinating landscaping proposals and creating a compost system. He founded Eco-Education, a student-run science education program, designing interactive dart frog vivariums and self-sufficient freshwater aquariums for elementary classrooms.

An aspiring environmental scientist, Justin spent his childhood exploring the wilderness with his family; his late father earned a spot in the Guinness Book of World Records as the first person to visit every national park in the U.S.

An AP Scholar with Distinction, Justin served two years as president of the California Scholarship Federation (CSF), leading meetings, arranging scholarships and organizing beach cleanups; under his leadership, CSF membership increased 25%. Jamie will study neuroscience and Spanish at Princeton University and plans a career in medicine.

burrito takes me back to a time when the world moved at a slower pace and taquerias took pride in their refried beans and put in just enough cheese to make it like my Grandmother Ruth used to make them.

Other house specialties include the combination which consists of burrito shredded beef and beans and the chicharron burrito, soft or hard tostada, taquitos and, of course, tacos. The green sauce is out of a dream about my grandmother cooking me a meal one last time.

The line can get long;

but, as I say, almost every time I bite into that burrito: "You know what I like!" Al and Beas is located at 2025 1st Street in Boyle Heights.

The origins of the taco are really unknown. One theory is that it dates back to the 18th century when miners created a concoction they called tacos de minero or miner's tacos. This makes sense considering miners would throw anything together for a quick meal before going back into the mine! One stop that has perfected the taco is the second taqueria Tito's Tacos in Culver City.

Since 1959, lines of people have formed both night and day for the tasty, hard shell tacos at this Culver City eatery. It is a bit rare and a bit "Gringo" to find a taqueria still making hard-shell tacos, but judging by the lines at Tito's the formula still works. Tito's mild and slushy, tomato-based salsa is still a favorite on the West side, even though some hard core taqueria eaters may complain it is a bit the parking can be tough, mild. Did I mention that the lines are long? Take heart because they move fast, and there's ample seating. Parking can be difficult, but worth the effort. Tito's Taco is located 11222 Washington Blvd. Culver City.

The third taqueria is in the Los Feliz District where at 2056 Hillhurst Ave. you'll find "an 8 by 10 feet piece of L.A. History!" That is what the Los Angeles Times said about "Mama" Socorro Herrera Yuca's Hut.

At Yuca's you may very well bite into thebest Carne Asada Burrito you've ever tasted! You want a Coke to go along with it? You'll be directed to the liquor store next door. Yucas can't be bothered with soft drinks when the food is the thing! The burrito is made with real beans and tender pieces of beef in a square, so the tasty sauce doesn't drip on your shirt. You may be surrounded by Toyota Priuses and Millennials who give you the answers to all your problems whether you ask them or not, but the food experience is worth it!

The fourth taqueria is in

the West San Fernando Valley. Las Fuentes is never a hit and miss! Breakfast, lunch or dinner—you can't go wrong! Appetizers include Nachos Al Carbon, shrimp nachos, and Papa Nachos to name a few.

Quesadillas include chicken or beef, shrimp. There are various types of burritos, but my favorite is the chilli relleno Burrito. I can't explain it other than to say "Yum, Yum!" Las Fuentes sells various types of tacos including fish, shrimp, chicken, and beef.

Las Fuentes offers a "Kiddy Corner" where kids can ordered anything from a hamburger, crispy tacos to tamales and enchilada plates. You order at the counter, and the food is brought to your table. Make sure you order a bowl of warm chips for 99 cents and make good use of the salsa bar that offers various types of salsas. Prices for kids and adults are reasonable, and I guarantee you that if you go, you'll keep going back. Las Fuentes islocated at 18415 Vanowen in the city of Reseda.

The last taqueria on the list is in the city of San Fernando. Carillo's Tortilleria is a family-run business that "started from nothing and grew to become a Southern Californiatradition." This place is known for some marvelous authentic Mexican food. It is a must stop for tamales. The beef and cheese with green chili tamales are very popular. They have combo plates that come with beans, rice and salsa.

Carrillo's also has an amazing Carnita and Asada plate that are excellent and reasonably priced. They sell Mexican Coke in those tall bottles. Their Menudo and other caldos are very popular, but there are seriously long lines for grub here. Carillo's Tortilleria is located at 1242 Pico St, San-Fernando.

I started my search for great Los Angeles taquerias with the goal of uncovering ten or so. I am at 25 and still going. If you're interested in discovering more taquerias, add me on Facebook.


